The identification and integrated treatment of co-occurring disorders are essential to the success of the mental health and alcohol and drug treatment systems in California. Collaboration with the criminal justice, educational, and child welfare systems is also essential.

This year's conference will focus upon "putting in place" the evidence-based practices shared in our previous conferences and shared for the first time this year.

The Conference Objectives are as follows:

- To further the collaboration between Alcohol and Drug Programs and the Department of Mental Health at the State and County levels;
- To identify evidence-based practices in addressing the complex needs of persons with co-occurring disorders and highlighting implementation strategies;
- To increase awareness of strategies which address the interrelationships between cultural issues and co-occurring disorders.

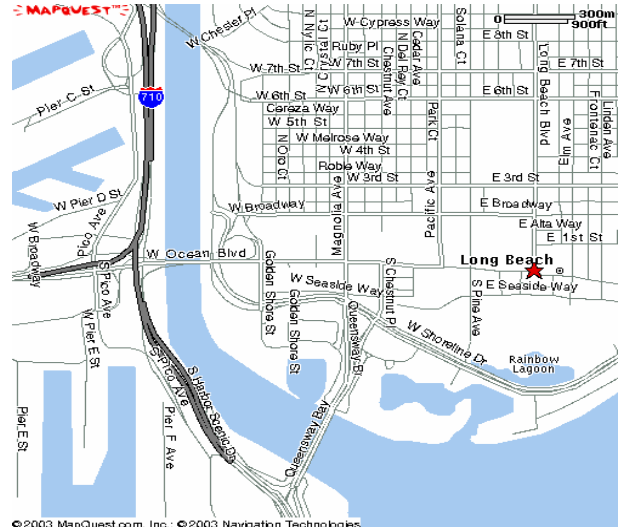
